The European Commission (EC) prepares a new cloud computing strategy-- one with hopes to widen cloud services adoption in order to add nearly €600 billion into EU GDP in the 2015-2020 period.



The chief aim of the strategy is to cut across what EC technology chief Neelie Kroes describes as the "jungle of standards" currently in place across the region.

It also addresses the concerns many businesses show regarding data security and the moving of data between different cloud providers.

The strategy has 4 chief aims:

- Ensuring the movement of data from one cloud to another-- and the withdrawal of data.
- EU-wide trustworthy cloud provider certification.
- Model cloud computing contracts.
- A "European Cloud Partnership" between the public and private sectors in order to strengthen the European industry against foreign (chiefly US) competition.
