Microsoft starts taking orders for the <u>Surface Hub</u>, the giant camera-equipped tablet the company hopes will replace videoconferencing and collaboration setups in enterprises across the world.

"Surface Hub is a fully integrated alternative to costly videoconferencing and digital whiteboard solutions, providing a complete collaboration experience at a competitive price."

First revealed back in January 2015, the Surface Hub is available in 2 sizes-- 55-inch (for small conference rooms, offices and "huddle spaces") and 84-inch (for larger meeting rooms). It carries cameras, speakers, mics, Bluetooth, NFC and stylus-based input, as well as large-screen apps configured for touch and stylus input.

The Surface Hub ships from September 2015 in Austria, Belgium, Denmark, France, Finland, Germany, Ireland, Italy, Norway, Portugal, Spain, Sweden and the UK.
